The Summer School in Sustainable Development at the University of Montpellier offers students the unique opportunity to learn about the major challenges currently facing the planet.

The courses cover most of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals outlined by the UN and aim to explain not only the theoretical underpinnings of the problems we face but also the practical solutions that can be adopted.

All courses will be taught in the English language by a team of professors specialized in the field. Students will work together on group projects, according to their particular interests, which will be presented to the class. Students who would like to improve their French, whatever their level, can also take language courses.

In this program, students will have 3 hours of class on Sustainable Development every morning during the two-week period. These courses will focus both on theoretical knowledge as well as its application in the real world. In addition, students can also take 1.5 hours of French language courses in the afternoon.
